10. What are your three favourite leisure activities?
11. What is your favourite main course, dessert, colour, musical instrument, entertainer, TV show?
12. What do you consider your most attractive and unattractive physical features?
13. What has been the biggest disappointment in your life to this point?
14. What were the major turning points in your life?
15. What do you consider your major successes?
16. What major goals do you have?

After partners have completed interviewing each other, take time to discuss together how it felt to learn to learn new information about each other.
